Bill and Norma Gordon began the project which was to become Hebron House in 1987. They had a vision for sharing their family home with individuals struggling with addiction, believing that people would benefit from being part of a structured family environment. This vision has been at the heart of the work Hebron has been doing ever since.

For more than thirty-five years, we helped over four hundred women break free of their addictive lifestyles. With Christian values at the centre of our approach, we created a safe and nurturing environment built on mutual respect and accountability, which is why ours were amongst the highest completion rates in the UK. Our people developed and refined a distinctive 12 Step-based approach, and understood the unique experiences that lead women to a life of addiction.

More recently the addition of our follow-on homes has allowed us to offer specialist independent living support to Hebron graduates who want to make a life for themselves in Norfolk. All of the women in our supported homes and many more that returned to their homes across the country are now in education or employment, living full and loving lives and we're proud of every single one.
